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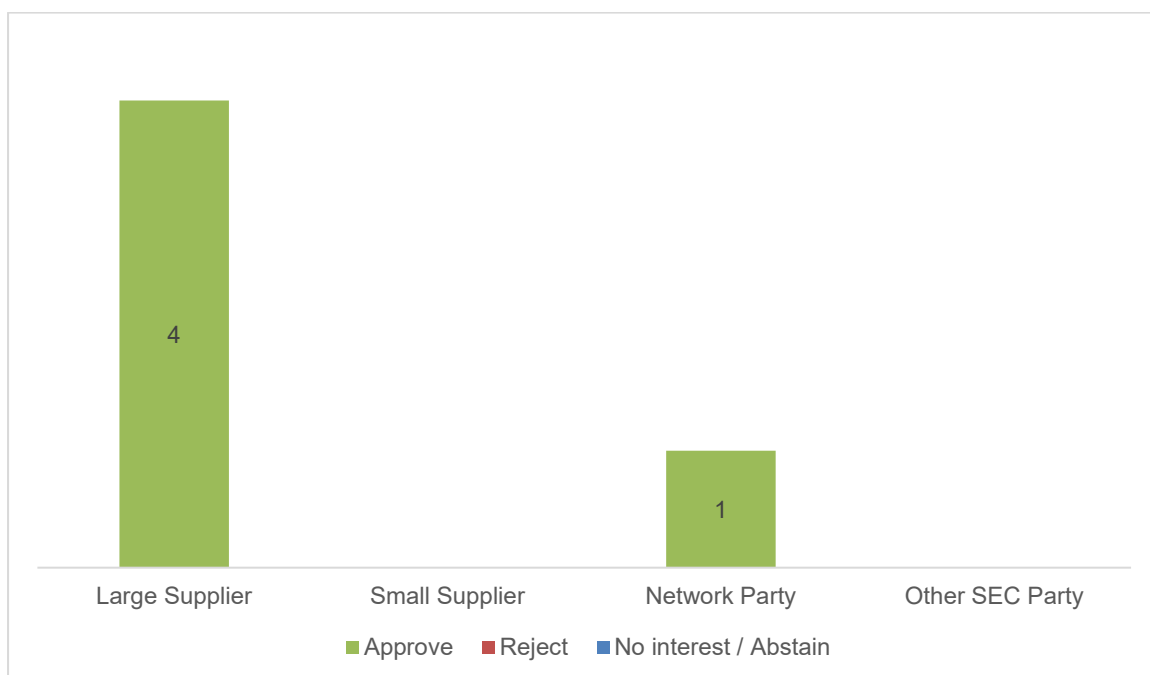

This is, at it's root, an issue with a service the DCC and it's service providers are already being paid to provide and should be resolved as part of providing that service.	-

British Gas	Large Supplier	We are keen to see this change approved and implemented as soon as possible. Do the preliminary changes (for November 2024 Maintenance release) require any Regression Testing? If so, presumably these will also be delayed, if SECMP0028 is deferred to June 2025.	MP239 (once approved) will be included in the November 2024 DCC maintenance release, which is not linked to a SEC Release or SECMP0028. The DCC stressed that a DCC maintenance release is a separate release and not part of SEC Release costings.
