Summary of conclusions

Modification Report Consultation

SECAS received six responses to the Modification Report Consultation. All respondents believed that the modification should be approved. They considered the modification better facilitated SEC Objectives (b)¹ and (g)².

¹ enable the Data Communications Company to comply at all times with the General Objectives of the Data Communications Company (as defined in the Data Communications Company Licence), and to efficiently discharge the other obligations imposed upon it by the Data Communications Company Licence.

² facilitate the efficient and transparent administration and implementation of this Code.

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Modification Report Consultation responses

Summary of responses

All respondents believed the modification should be approved, as the solution would be a proactive measure to mitigate potential risks to the Data Communications Company (DCC) Systems.

The Proposer responded to the Modification Report Consultation and highlighted that the modification better facilitated SEC Objective (b) which relates to DCC's first enduring General Objective³. The solution would allow the DCC to better manage the operation of the DCC System.

Another respondent expressed their support of the solution put forward, as setting Transactions per Second (TPS) limits would allow the DCC to suitably queue Southbound requests in the event of high message volumes, dependant on the User system.
