The aim for the TABASC is to **REVIEW** the Proposed Solution and provide feedback where necessary

Overview

- The DCC are required to remove Devices from the SMI that have been in a pending status for 36 months or more.
- No established processes for the re-prenotification of Communications Hubs that have been removed by the DCC.

Issue



- Risk of increased failed installs due to engineers attempting to install removed CHs.
- Increasing cost to industry by site visit costs and wasted CH assets.
- Increased complexity and cost on Suppliers to pre-notify DCC CHs that have been removed from the SMI (after 36 months).

Impact

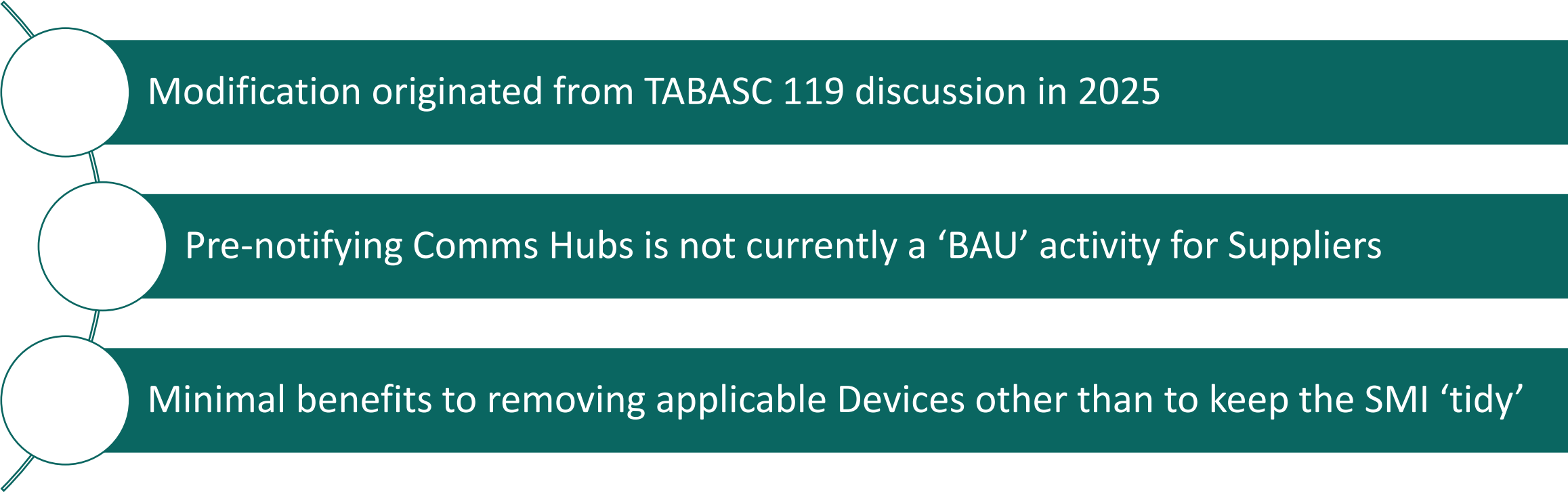


- Remove the DCC obligation to remove Communications Hubs from the SMI if they have been in a 'pending' state for 36 months or more (SEC Appendix AC)

Potential Solution



■ MP313: Points of Note

■ MP313: Proposed Solution

- Remove the obligation in SEC Appendix AC requiring the DCC to remove Devices from the SMI where the status of a Device has remained as 'pending' for 36 months or more.

8. Reactivating Decommissioned or Suspended Devices

8.1 Where the Responsible Supplier wishes to change the SMI Status of any Device (other than a Type 2 Device) from 'decommissioned' or 'whitelisted' to 'pending', then the Responsible Supplier shall send the DCC a Service Request to that effect. Provided the Device in question is of (or is part of) a Device Model that is identified in the Central Products List, the DCC shall change the SMI Status to 'pending'.

~~8.2 Where the SMI Status of a Device has remained as 'pending' for 36 months, then the DCC shall remove the Device from the Smart Metering Inventory.~~

~~8.38.2~~ Where a Device ceases to be Suspended (either as a result of the Device Model being added to the Central Product List, or the Device's Device Model being modified such that it is on the Central Product List), the DCC shall change the SMI Status of that Device to the status it held immediately prior to its Suspension.
