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## Technical Architecture and Business Architecture Sub-Committee (TABASC) Meeting Headlines on 12 December 2019

At each meeting, the TABASC receives updates from the DCC, BEIS and other Sub-Committees on matters of relevance to the TABASC. The TABASC also review the minutes of the previous meeting (TABASC\_49\_1212\_02), its Activity Planner (TABASC\_49\_1212\_12) and Risk Register and Issues Log (TABASC\_49\_1212\_11) monthly to ensure these are up to date.

Alongside these items, the following items were discussed:

- ELEXON and Ofgem provided an update on the Market-Wide Half Hourly Settlement, explaining the Target Operating Model (TOM), the next stage of work to develop the detail and necessary, transition approach and overall programme timetable. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_01).
- DCC updates concerning:
  - Extending duration of 2G coverage and LTE Communications Hubs solution. The TABASC provided feedback specifically on the timelines and customer engagement. (TABASC\_49\_2111\_03); and
  - DCC Change Coordination, highlighting that the information requested from Users is being simplified following previous feedback. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_04).
- SECAS provided the TABASC with a problem statement and high-level assessment of options for Alerts lost during DCC outages. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_06).
- SECAS provided the TABASC with a Programme Definition Document for transitioning the issue management process from BEIS to SECAS. (TABASC 49 1212 07).
- SECAS provided the TABASC with a Project Initiation Document (PID) for supporting the
  Market-Wide Half-Hourly Settlement project whereby the TABASC APPROVED participation
  in the Architecture Working Group until completion of the Market-Wide Half-Hourly
  Settlements functional requirements for interfaces and data transfer, subject to confirming
  funding arrangements. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_08)
- SECAS provided the TABASC with a PID for supporting Market Structure Impacts (changes
  to other Codes that could impact the SEC and smart metering) specifically focusing on <u>BSC</u>
  <u>Modification P379 'Multiple Suppliers through Meter Splitting'</u>. The TABASC **APPROVED** the
  overall participation in industry changes and the proposed activities set out specifically for
  BSC Modification P379 engagement. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_09).
- SECAS provided the TABASC with a highlight report CPL Enhancement Project highlighting that the project status is green, with the remaining activities due to complete by the target dates in the new year (TABASC\_49\_1212\_10).
- SECAS provided the TABASC with the work package for Q4 (January March 2020) whereby the TABASC RECOMMENDED the work package for SECCo Board approval. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_13).
- SECAS proposed an updated set of TABASC principles for assessing Modification Proposals
  whereby the TABASC AGREED the approach for using the principles in the future, subject to
  applying minor amendments to enhance the existing principles. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_16).





• SECAS provided the TABASC with an overview of the new Draft Proposal's and Modification Proposals raised since the November meeting. (TABASC\_49\_1212\_17).
