MP105 'Sending SR11.2 to Devices in Suspended State' Conclusions Report – version 1.0

About this document

This document summarises the responses received to the Modification Report Consultation and the decision of the Change Board regarding approval or rejection of this modification.

Summary of conclusions

Change Board

The Change Board voted to approve MP105. It believed the modification better facilitated SEC Objective (a)¹.

Modification Report Consultation

SECAS received three responses to the Modification Report Consultation. All three respondents believed this modification should be approved and that it better facilitated SEC Objective (a).



¹ To facilitate the efficient provision, installation, and operation, as well as interoperability, of Smart Metering Systems at Energy Consumers' premises within Great Britain.



Modification Report Consultation responses

Summary of responses

All three respondents believed this modification should be approved. They noted that the issue presents a flaw in the system that needs to be resolved. They agreed the Proposed Solution will prevent Devices from being wrongfully 'Suspended' upon a successful firmware update and would also ensure the Smart Metering Inventory (SMI) is aligned to the firmware versions held on Devices.

One respondent believed the Proposed Solution to be relatively simple but considered that the costs did not reflect this and therefore found it hard to justify the costs.

The Change Board voted to approve MP105 under Self-Governance.
