SECAS as a Critical Friend

What is a Critical Friend?

Principle 1 of the Code Administration Code of Practice (CACoP) describes that Code Administrators should act as a 'critical friend'.

The role of a critical friend is to provide support to all with an interest in the Modification Processes, including any under-represented parties, such as Small Supplier Parties and consumer representatives.

SECAS will therefore endeavour to provide a service that ensures all Party views are heard and communicated.

A high-level summary of the services you can expect from SECAS when the Modification Process is fully switched on include:

- SEC guidance materials, covering areas including the Modification Process, on the SEC Website;
- Supporting SEC Parties to draft and develop Modifications;
- Providing constructive feedback on any Party's draft Modifications;
- A Helpdesk function where SEC queries or questions will be responded to quickly;
- Producing easy to follow Modification documents;
- Ensuring all views on Modifications are discussed and challenged, including assumptions and assertions;
- Encouraging participation in the Modification Process;
- Supporting Parties with limited resources to engage in the Modification Process;
- Using Modification specific distribution lists to ensure interested Parties are kept informed of SEC Changes; and
- Creating specific Modification website pages where all the information and documentation relating to each Modification can be found.
