Details of Proposer				
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#### 1. What issue are you looking to address?

SEC <u>Section M 'General'</u> sets out provisions for the suspension, expulsion and withdrawal of SEC Parties from the SEC, with M8.1 specifically setting out provisions related to Events of Default and what would constitute a default under the SEC. M8.1(a) states that a Party is a 'Defaulting Party' if:

• it does not hold an Energy Licence and has not, during any period of six consecutive months, done any or all of the following: (i) taken one or more Services; and/or (ii) made a request for a formal offer for a proposed Elective Communication Service;

M8.1(a) currently has a transitional variation applied to it which is due to expire on 31 October 2018 (meaning that, until this date, this obligation does not apply to SEC Parties). However, from 31 October 2018, any SEC Party not holding a licence that is not a DCC User or otherwise taking Services or Elective Communications Services will be in default of the SEC, as per M8.1(a).

**2. Why does this issue need to be addressed?** (*i.e. Why is doing nothing not an option?*)

There are a number of SEC Parties who have joined the code to gain access to information and be part of the market. However, they have no need or desire to take on DCC services. Placing such parties, and a lot of them, in default is not proportionate nor in line with original intent of provisions.

#### 3. What is your Proposed Solution?

This Modification proposes changes to SEC Section M to remove 8.1(a), ensuring that Parties not holding a licence will not be in default should there be no need for them to become a DCC user or otherwise taking Services or Elective Communications Services from the DCC by 31 October 2018.

#### 4. What SEC objectives does this Modification better facilitate?

This modification will better facilitate SEC Objective  $(g^1)$  as it will facilitate the efficient and transparent administration and implementation of this Code.
