

Summary of SECMP0019

What is the issue?

Currently suppliers can determine their own naming convention for ALCS or HCALCS. In a Change of Supplier (CoS) event, the non-standardised namings may result in incoming suppliers applying incorrect settings for each switch.

What is the Proposed Solution?

SECMP0019 proposes to introduce a standardised naming convention for all possible ALCS and HCALCS that can be used by all suppliers. The list would be published on the SEC Website and maintained by SECAS. Import Suppliers would be able (but not obliged) to use this list when setting ALCS and HCALCS labels.

Impacts – Proposed Solution

Party

Other than the Large and Small Suppliers, there are no other SEC Parties impacted due to the implementation of this modification.

System

There are no impacts on Central Systems or Participant Systems.

Implementation Costs

The total estimated implementation cost to deliver SECMP0019 is approximately £1,200 as these costs are limited to SECAS's time and effort.

Implementation Date

SECAS recommends an implementation date of:

• 1st November 2018, if a decision to approve is made by 18th October 2018.

Working Group's initial views

The Working Group believes unanimously that SECMP0019 does better facilitate the SEC Objectives. The WG therefore believes that this Modification Proposal should be approved. SECMP0019
